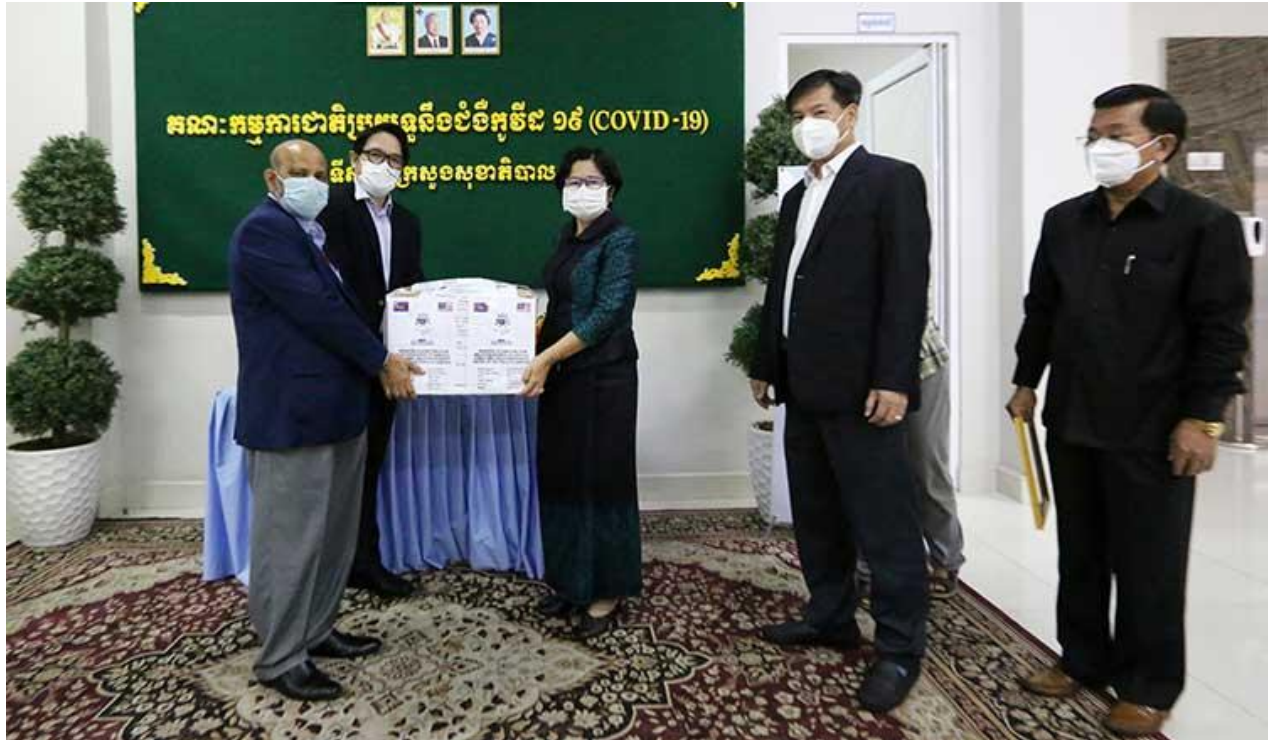


MBCC, Malaysian companies and Khmer Times provide aid to combat Covid-19 pandemic
